


OUT & ABOUT IN CLAYTON COUNTY

RECIPE OF THE MONTH

Frosted Cranberry Drop Cookies

INGREDIENTS

1/2 cup butter, softened
1 cup sugar
3/4 cup packed brown sugar
1/4 cup whole milk
1 large egg
2 tablespoons orange juice
3 cups all-purpose flour
1 teaspoon baking powder
1/2 teaspoon salt
1/4 teaspoon baking soda
2 1/2 cups chopped fresh or frozen cranberries
1 cup chopped walnuts

Frosting:

1/3 cup butter
2 cups confectioners' sugar
1 ¹/₂ teaspoons vanilla extract
2 to 4 tablespoons hot water

DIRECTIONS

1. In a bowl, cream butter and sugars. Add milk, egg and orange juice; mix well. Combine the flour, baking powder, salt and baking soda; add to the creamed mixture and mix well. Stir in

cranberries and nuts. 2. Drop by tablespoonfuls 2 in. apart onto greased baking sheets. Bake at 350°F until golden brown, 12-15 minutes. Cool on wire racks. 3. For frosting, heat the butter in a saucepan over low heat until golden brown, about 5 minutes. Cool for 2 minutes; transfer to a small bowl. Add sugar and vanilla. Beat in water, 1 tablespoon at a time, until frosting reaches desired consistency. Frost the cookies.
